## Details of the main barriers to educational achievement that disadvantaged children face

Out of the 49 children receiving pupil premium funding:

- 11 children are on the special needs register. Therefore this can effect progress and achievement
- 15 children are supported by the Learning Mentor because they have social and emotional issues, some children experience multiple barriers to learning which can effect progress and achievement
- 12 children are LAC/post LAC, some children experience mental health issues due to this, and progress and achievement can be effected How school will measure the effect of pupil premium
  - Every half term the provision map for disadvantaged children is updated and achievement and progress is monitored and evaluated. Children receive interventions when appropriate
  - Every individual child receiving pupil premium funding is discussed at the half termly pupil progress meetings
  - · Progress and achievement of disadvantaged children as a group are monitored and evaluated
